- Offer help in identifying items of interest from amongst the wealth of primary sources the originals of which are distant, but copies of which reside here (mostly in microform).
- Explore how we can bring distantly located primary sources to you through Interlibrary Loan.

Researchers in all fields are welcome. Participants in past seminars have come from a wide range of departments, including American Studies, Sociology, Women's Studies, History, Nursing, Education, Art History, and Health and Sport Studies. The seminar's target audience is researchers whose work can be enhanced by using primary sources.
